That is why Meals on Wheels programs from across the country are joining forces to raise awareness and support to ensure we can continue to address food insecurity and malnutrition, combat social isolation, enable independence and improve health for decades to come.

During the month, community-based Meals on Wheels programs from across the country will join forces for the annual awareness campaign to celebrate this successful public-private partnership and garner the resources needed to reach every senior in need of a nutritious meal, friendly visit and safety check.

"Now is an important time for us to unite to ensure that Meals on Wheels is there for all of our senior neighbors in need," said Ellie Hollander, President and CEO of Meals on Wheels America. "In the face of soaring demand and costs that surpass our current resources, we need to come together as communities to bridge the gaps.
