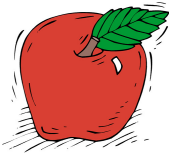

What is I&RS?

I&RS is a state mandated multidisciplinary team which designs, implements, and monitors intervention plans for students experiencing one or more of the following difficulties:

- *Learning
- *Behavior
- *Health
- *Substance Abuse

Prior to referral to I&RS, a thorough and descriptive "Team Assistance Plan" will be developed by the pupil's academic team. referral to I&RS will occur if this plan does not produce the desired outcome.

The academic team is responsible for informing the parent/guardian of the I&RS referral.

HOW TEACHERS CAN HELP:

- * Be aware of changes in student behavior
- * Assist student through a variety of approaches
- * Contact parents/guardians
- * Access Counselor.
- * Refer to I&RS Team

I&RS

- *Teacher becomes part of I&RS.
- *I&RS reviews all relevant information on the child.
- *Problem identified or reidentified
- *I&RS Team brainstorms intervention
- *Teacher chooses intervention with which he/she is comfortable

Understanding Section 504

Section 504 is a federal rights statute which protects the right of students with disabilities. A 504 Accommodation Plan is designed for each student according to individual need.

Who is eligible for a 504?

An eligible student

Has...

Has a record of having...

Is regarded as having...

A physical or mental impairment that substantially limits a major life activity such as:

*walking

*seeing

*hearing

*caring for oneself

*performing manual tasks

*breathing

*learning

*speaking

*working

Please note "eligibility" does not necessarily mean 504.
