Ewing High School is on a semester, 4x4, intensive block schedule. In a traditional year, instructional blocks contain 87 minutes. Students take 4 units of instruction per semester (no study halls are permitted), 8 per year. A unit is worth 5 credits. Students have the potential to earn 160 credits (32 units) in 4 years. A minimum of 140 credits (28 units) are required for graduation.

GRADING SYSTEM: Students are graded on a 100-point percentage scale. A grade of P indicates a passing grade with credits earned: however, it is not included in the calculation of the student's GPA. Numerical grades should be interpreted as follows:

GPA & DECILE: The GPA is weighted with AP® courses receiving a higher value than an Honors class, an Honors class receiving a higher value than a college preparatory (level one) class, and the college preparatory class receiving a higher value than select essentials classes. Admissions officers seeking to convert the EHS weighted GPA to an un-weighted GPA should do so by using the chart provided in "Grading System" above. A student's grade point average and rank in class reported in decile percentage will be entered on the student's record.
