Dear Parents/Guardians:

We are presently in the process of planning the Promotion Ceremony for our Eighth Grade class. It will be held at Ewing High School on the Bruce Martz Field at the Athletic Complex on Tuesday, June 21, 2022 at 6:30 p.m. In the event of inclement weather, the event will be held indoors in the Ewing High School Gymnasium at 6:30 p.m.

Students who meet the following criteria will be allowed to participate in the ceremony:

1. The student must be receiving a final passing grade in all major subjects (Math, Science, Social Studies, and Language Arts). In addition, all attendance requirements must be met (see Attendance Policy). Those not meeting the requirements may not participate. Students who fall below the requirement after the tabulation of final grades or attendance will be considered ineligible for the Promotion Certificate.
2. Those students who have been involved with excessive disciplinary infractions during the school year may not be allowed to participate in the Promotion Ceremony. Those among this group will be identified and notified by the Administration. They may pick up their promotion certificate between July 1st and August 31, 2022.
3. **All fines for lost or damaged textbooks, chromebooks, instruments, athletic uniforms and equipment, and/or id's, art projects, etc., must be paid no later than 4:00 p.m. on Friday, June 10th.**

Students who have such outstanding obligations will not be permitted to participate in the practice or promotion ceremony. Fines can be seen on your parent access account in Genesis.

4. All students are expected to dress in a manner appropriate to a Promotion Ceremony. Students should wear "dress" shirts, "dress" slacks, skirts, dresses, appropriate shoes or sandals. Ties and "dress" jackets are certainly acceptable but not mandatory. Shorts, jeans and t-shirts will **not** be permitted.

Excessively short skirts and dresses will **not** be permitted. Dresses/skirts must be equal to or longer than fingertip length when arms are at the sides.

All interpretations and decisions on a student's dress for the ceremony will be made by the school administration prior to the activity. Those whose appearance is deemed unacceptable will not be permitted to participate. We are requesting the utmost decorum for our students as they cross the stage.

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5. Each participating child will receive four (4) tickets: 2 red and 2 white to the ceremony for use by relatives. **Therefore, there will be no extra tickets issued.** Only individuals with tickets will be permitted into the ceremony beginning at 5:45 p.m.
6. All spectators (all 4 tickets) will be allowed on the field. In case of inclement weather, **the two (2) red tickets will be honored for entrance to the ceremony in the Ewing High School gymnasium. The two (2) white tickets will be honored for entrance into the auditorium to watch the ceremony on the big screen.** All tickets will be collected on the field.
7. Special practices will be held during the school day on June 20th and 21st. Students not in attendance for the practices will not be permitted to participate in the ceremony.
8. Balloons, or other objects which block the vision of spectators, may not be brought into the bleachers.
9. **Students can begin to be dropped off at 5:45 p.m. by the Ewing High School Gymnasium doors. Students must be in their seats by 6:00 p.m.**
